

Directions to Three Springs Organic Farm Saturday, October 21, 10am-12pm

From Tulsa (time: approximately 1 hour): get on US-412 going East. Go approx. 30 miles towards Siloam Springs, AR. A few miles East of the Chouteau exit, 412 turns into the Cherokee Turnpike (a toll road—have change with you). Take the Turnpike approx. 17 miles to the Rose/Leach/Oaks Exit. This is the second exit on the Turnpike. At the end of the exit ramp, make a right onto Alternate 412. You will travel approximately 3.4 miles East on Alternate 412 until you get to the town of Leach. This is a small town-- look for the green sign that says “Rocky Ford State Park”. Here you will turn Right, going South on road 540. Travel on this road approximately 4.7 miles until you pass over Spring Creek and come to a “T” intersection. At the “T”, make a Left onto Hwy 82A. You are at Rocky Ford Park. Continue with directions below.

From Rocky Ford Park: Travel approximately 2.3 miles east on Hwy 82A. You will see the driveway to the farm on your left just after a curve in the road. There is an open green gate at the driveway. Cross the bridge over the creek. Park below the house, yellow with a red roof.

Directions to King’s Curve/Cooper’s Bridge Saturday, November 4, 10am-12pm

Cooper’s Bridge is south of the old Twin Bridges area where the water starts to back up from the Cedar Crest dam.

Take Ear Bob Road off Highway 82 just south of where it crosses Spring Creek by the Spring Creek Country Store. Travel approximately two miles to the new bridge, turning right on 439.2 Road. Cross Spring Creek. Turn left.

King’s Curve is approximately one mile downstream (look for SCC sign). Travel one more mile to your first left which will take you to Cooper’s Bridge.

If you would like to work at King’s Curve, gather gloves and trash bags as needed and head back that way. Leave full trash bags along the road for pick-up.

If you would like to work at Cooper’s Bridge, cross the bridge and park in the mowed area. Look for the Spring Creek event sign.

Canoes can be launched at King’s Curve where you can collect downstream until you reach Cooper’s Bridge. Leave trash there for collection. Continue on to Cedar Crest where you can take out your canoe and be shuttled back to your vehicle. Or you may think of another option that suits you.
